



## MISSION

Sanctuary for Families is dedicated to the safety, healing and self-determination of victims of domestic violence and related forms of gender violence. Through comprehensive services for our clients and their children, and through outreach, education and advocacy, we strive to create a world in which freedom from gender violence is a basic human right.

## PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In FY 2014-2015, we increased our impact by nearly 50%, serving nearly 15,000 adults and children. Over 200 full-time staff communicated with clients in more than 30 languages. We provided services in 19 locations throughout New York City, and engaged more than 2,000 volunteers.

### CLINICAL & CRISIS SERVICES

Our social workers supported over 5,600 survivors and their children through individual and group counseling, crisis intervention, referrals and a range of supportive services to counteract the deep emotional effects of abuse and help our clients thrive.

### LEGAL SERVICES

Staff attorneys, with the support of over 500 pro bono lawyers, provided legal representation, advocacy and related services to nearly 5,800 clients, with positive outcomes in family and matrimonial law, immigration, public benefits, and other specialty areas.

### SHELTER SERVICES

Five shelter locations offered confidential housing and supportive services to 505 women and children. 70% of clients in our Sarah Burke House transitional shelter moved into permanent housing.

### ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT SERVICES

146 survivors of gender violence participated in the Economic Empowerment Program's intensive career training workshop. 750 additional clients received financial literacy support, employment referrals, education and additional services to help them achieve economic independence.

### CHILDREN & YOUTH SERVICES

Recognizing the unique needs faced by the youngest victims and witnesses of gender violence, we assisted over 2,700 children, teens and youth by providing educational advocacy, tutoring, recreational activities, afterschool enrichment and childcare.

### OUTREACH, EDUCATION & TRAINING

We provided outreach, education and trainings to approximately 40,000 concerned community members, including potential victims, families, teachers, clergy, judges, law enforcement and service providers. These public efforts increased awareness about gender violence and improved prevention efforts in our communities.

### SYSTEMS-CHANGE ADVOCACY

We successfully advocated for improved policies and legislation around issues affecting survivors of domestic violence and sex trafficking, including passage of the Trafficking Victims Protection and Justice Act in New York State. Our advocacy on behalf of clients in need of affordable housing options encouraged New York City's creation of the LINC housing program.
