My ex-partner and father of my daughter, Jose Antonio, beat, raped, stalked, and threatened to kill me regularly for over ten years. After 4 years of abuse, I fled to different locations but at each place, he found me and hurt me. In or around 2016, he forcibly entered my apartment and strangled me. I tried to defend myself but he was too strong. My neighbors came out to save me that day. The following day, I filed a report with the Fiscalia de la Mujer. Jose Antonio was detained for 2 hours and then released. He later threatened to hurt me again and said the police would not stop him. Every weekend, Jose Antonio came to my place and ordered me to cook for him and give him money. He forced me to have sex with him at gun point. Jose Antonio said I had to have sex with him because I was his woman and I had to obey him. When I refused, he put his gun in my mouth and threatened to kill me. In or around 2021, I ran into Jose Antonio while I was walking to work. He pulled his gun out and put it against my head. He said I was running out of time, and that he was going to kill me if I didn't get back with him.

I am afraid that Jose Antonio will kill me if I return to Guatemala. I think that he will do that as soon as I return. I left without telling him and I think he believes I am his property and so was not allowed to leave. Neighbors told me that Jose Antonio was looking for me after I left and asking people where I am now. There is no place in Guatemala where I would be safe and no one there would protect me. I tried moving to different places but Jose Antonio always found me.

I am Christian. I attended services as often as I could and prayed for my and my daughter's safety.

I am afraid that my ex-partner, Jose Antonio, will torture me if I return to Honduras. Jose Antonio has beaten me, kicked me, strangled me, raped me, and threatened me with a gun various times. I filed a report against him but the Fiscalia and the police did not protect me. They released him after 2 hours. He threatened to kill me if I filed another report against him. The authorities in Guatemala don't protect women. There is nowhere I could be safe in Guatemala because Jose Antonio always found where I moved in the past.

My sister Carolina Chavez Paz applied for asylum in 2020. Her case is still pending before the immigration court in Texas.

I traveled through Mexico by bus. I stayed in Mexico for about two or three weeks. I did not apply for asylum in Mexico because I did not know anyone there and I did not think that my daughter and I would be safe there.

After my daughter and I arrived in the United States on October 20, 2022, I focused on enrolling my child in school, finding a safe place to live and legal assistance in order to apply for asylum. I visited several offices and waited for them to call me back as they had promised. However, around June 2023, I began a relationship with a Miguel Angel Sanchez, who I met many years ago in Guatemala and who I believed was a good man. Around July 2023, after my daughter and I moved in with Miguel, he began controlling and isolating me. He began following me and soon forbade me from leaving the apartment without him. Miguel insulted and beat me frequently. Around mid-September 2023, Miguel beat me and strangled me after I left the apartment to pick up my sick daughter at school. A neighbor called the police and Miguel was arrested. After Miguel's arrest, I was contacted by and referred to several agencies. I tried contacting immigration law offices again and after several weeks, I was able to speak with an immigration attorney at a Family Justice Center who agreed to assist me pro se. I did my best to apply for asylum as soon as I was able to.
